

In the seasonal period running up to Christmas time, we expect to see a rise in residential burglary. This is primarily due to a combination of increased hours of darkness and the increased prospect of people having more valuables in their homes due to the purchase and storage of Christmas presents. These factors makes this period of the year the most lucrative time for burglars to offend.

**Operation Grotto** is TVP South Buck's crime initiative to focus on this habitual rise in burglaries and will be running until the New Year. Police will be conducting an increased number of overt patrols, with a focus on identified high risk areas for residential burglary. In addition, police will be utilising enhanced intelligence gathering methods to identify suspects and see more offenders arrested.

We will also be distributing relevant crime prevention advice to help you take the steps to ensure your home is as safe and secure as possible.

Message sent on behalf of the Office of the Police & Crime Commissioner: Residents asked to share their views on policing budget

Matthew Barber is asking residents to share views on which areas they would like the policing element of council tax to be focused in the 2024/25 budget by completing his Local Crime Survey.

The Police and Crime Commissioner is due to set the 2024/25 policing budget by the end of January 2024. The allocation of central government funding for forces is expected to be received in December.

Alongside this, the current funding settlement allows Police and Crime Commissioners to increase council tax by up to £10 (for a Band D property) in order to make additional investments in policing (and last year increases of up to £15 were permitted).

Matthew Barber said: "As Police and Crime Commissioner, it is my responsibility to ensure that Thames Valley Police has the resources to effectively prevent and investigate crime, support victims and protect communities from harm.

"Setting the budget is often a complex process in balancing priorities, and one which is again this year taking place against a challenging economic backdrop.

"Economic pressures such as high utility, fuel, and vehicle costs continue to impact policing budgets and I am acutely aware that cost of living pressures are affecting households across the Thames Valley.

"Thames Valley residents deserve and expect to receive an exceptional service from their police force. I want to ensure that the budget can support this, deliver value for money for residents and address the concerns and priorities of communities.

"This coming financial year, I want to see continued investment in local neighbourhood policing. There have already been significant improvements made, but I am determined to increase visible policing within our communities and to tackle issues such as shoplifting and keep burglaries low.

"By providing your feedback, you can help shape important decisions about police funding and how Thames Valley Police can continue to work to keep us all safe."

## **Churchills most secret airfield in WW2 – Ian Griffith**

This presentation is based on research carried out by Ian Griffith into the activities undertaken by the Special Duty RAF Squadrons at RAF Tempsford.

It covers the role of the Special Operations Executive(SOE) in building an army of Special Agents and the role that RAF Tempsford played in dropping enemy agents into occupied territory.

Ian's father-in-law Captain John Affleck, who lived in Mayflower Way, Farnham Common for many years was a pilot in 161 Squadron flying Lysanders and Hudsons into occupied territory. His story and achievements are featured including Operation Bludgeon where his Hudson got stuck in the mud in France. Operation Bludgeon is the most frequently mentioned operation in all the books on RAF Tempsford.

**Ian Griffith** worked in Sales and Marketing for ICI Paints Division for 20 years before joining The Chartered Institute of Marketing in Cookham as Marketing Director.

Set up own business, Marketing Quality Assurance, in 1990 to provide training, assessment and accreditation services to companies in the Services Sector. Ian is a member of Burnham Beeches Rotary Club.
